

# Powell Recreation District Youth Soccer

(Revised 3/2021)

#### The Laws (Rules) Summary

<u>Kickoff</u>- To start the game or period, and after each goal, a kickoff is taken from the center circle. <u>Throw In</u>- After the ball has completely crossed the side boundary lines, a throw in is awarded



against the team that last touched the ball. The throw in is taken from where the ball left the field and must be thrown with two hands from behind and over the head, while both feet remain on the ground on or behind the touchline.

<u>Goal Kick</u>- The goal kick is taken by the defending team each time the ball crosses the goal line and was last touched by an attacking player. The ball may be placed anywhere in the goal area and is not considered back in play until it has been kicked out of the penalty area.

<u>Corner Kick</u>- This kick is taken by the attacking team each time the ball is kicked by the defense over its own goal line. The ball is placed in the arc in the corner of the field and kicked into play by the attacking team.

<u>**Penalties**</u>- Lower and Middle League: All fouls will be considered minor fouls. Therefore, opponents will be awarded indirect kicks for fouls committed against them. Penalty kicks will not be taken.

**Indirect Kick**- Whereas major fouls lead to a direct scoring opportunity for the kicker, a minor foul leads to an indirect free kick, requiring that a player other than the kicker touch the ball before it passes into the goal.

**Direct Kick-** (Upper League only) Major fouls result in a direct fee kick, from which a goal may be directly scored. **Penalty Kick-** (only used in the Upper League) A penalty kick is awarded when a defending player commits major (penal) foul within his or her own penalty area while the ball is in play.

**Fouls**- *Major (Penal) Fouls:* To be a major foul, it must have been committed carelessly, recklessly, or with disproportionate force, or in the referee's judgment, committed intentionally. All Fouls will be considered Minor (non-penal) Fouls in the Lower and Middle Leagues.

Kicking or attempting to kick an opponent.

Striking or attempting to strike an opponent.

Pushing an opponent.

Charging an opponent.

Tripping an opponent.

Jumping at an opponent.

The following major fouls require only that they be committed:

When **tackling**, making contact with opponent before the ball. Tackling is not allowed in the Lower League. **Holding** an opponent.

Handling the ball deliberately. Goalkeepers may only use their hands within the penalty area.

*Minor (non-penal) Fouls:* Minor fouls result in an indirect free kick. All Fouls will be considered Minor (non-penal) Fouls in the Lower and Middle Leagues.

**Dangerous Play** Including, high kicking near another player's head or trying to play a ball held by a goalkeeper. **Impeding the Progress of an Opponent** Getting between an opponent and the ball when not playing the ball. **Goalkeeper Infringements** Goalkeeper taking more than 4 steps while controlling the ball with his or her hands, or

Goalkeeper Intringements Goalkeeper taking more than 4 steps while controlling the ball with his or her hands, or otherwise wasting time.

Offsides- Enforced in the Upper League, and not called in the Middle or Lower Leagues.

#### Modifications and Guidelines-

1. Time- Lower League: 4 quarters of 9 minutes (36 minute game), running time

Middle League: 6 periods of 8 minutes (48 minute game), running time

Upper League: 6 periods of 9 minutes (56 minute game), running time

All substitutions may be made between periods at the official's notification.

- 2. Number of Players- *lower league:* 7 players on the field at a time; *middle league:* 8 players; *upper league:* 8 players
- 3. Each player is required to play at least half of each game.
- 4. <u>All spectators will be required to stay outside the fenced area.</u>
- 5. **Each** game will start promptly at the scheduled time. Each team must be at the game site 10 minutes prior to the game time for warm-ups.
- 6. Unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of team members, coaches or spectators will not be tolerated.
